1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Ramesh Phirodia Education Trusts, Mumbai is an organization established with the objective of imparting quality education to the economically and socially weaker sections of the rural areas. The College has so far contributed substantially in educational and social affairs. College of Arts, Commerce and Science was transferred to Ramesh Phirodia Education Trusts in 2002 from Sahyadri Bahujan Prasarak Samaj Sanstha, Sangamner after that financial poor students of Sakur plateau area of Sangamner taluka started getting quality education through this College. Ramesh Phirodia College was established at Sakur in view of the fact that the facilities of Higher Education in Sakur village are far away like Sangamner, Nagar and the students of Sakur area cannot go for education due to lack of transport facilities and various difficulties . Educational facilities have been made available to students in rural areas at a affordable fee.

The College is built in a green area spread over 2.2 acres of land. Strives to maintain natural and ecological balance. The College has effective & sufficient required infrastructure facilities.

College Library has more than 7000 books and 10 Journals Also, 5 newspapers are available for students.

An affiliated course of Savitribai Phule Pune University are run in the College to promote high quality higher education. Various subjects are taught in the Arts, Commerce & Science Programm.

Various activities are carried out in the College for the overall development of the students. College organizes various competitions as well as various skill based program such as writing, singing, etc. are inculcated in the students.

Activities like study tours, field work, survey are conducted in the College to give experiential education to the students.

The College has 3 undergraduate degree programs of SPPU. It has 5 academic departments which includes Bachelor of Science in Chemistry, Bachelor of Commerce in Marketing and Bachelor of Arts in Geography, Marathi and English.

Special guidance is provided for students career. The College has signed MoUs with Nilaya, Satyam Institute, Career Katta & Infoysis, through this, students are taught skills based courses along with traditional courses. Therefore, students come out of the College with skills.

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The college has reached a high level of excellence due to the constant support and encouragement of the management.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

College has a large number of students from economically weaker sections. The College provides higher education in nominal cost (20 Rs) admission fee. Staff members are using LMS & MIS for effective learning and teaching. The college has excellent & Modern Infrastructure facility with CCTV cameras for safety and security. The College campus is clean, beautiful and green. College has organized continuous traditional, supportive and innovative activities such as Career Katta, Nirbhaya Kanya Abhiyan, Karate Training, Yoga. Tree Plantation, Cleaning of fort and villages. Also public awareness activities are carried out under NSS of the College.

Motivated staff is an important asset of the College. This results in better relation with all the stakeholders. Scholarship for economically poor such as SC/ST/NT/OBC students to the maximum extent is provided Financial assistance to meritorious students from low income families is arranged.

Competitive examinations like MPSC, UPSC guidance and mentoring are conducted in the College to improve student's skill which help in boosting their confidence. Staff Quarter facility is available in free basis for staff. College organizes events such as Parent Meeting, Welcome function, Career Guidance, Quiz Competition, Marathi Gaurav Din, Poster Presentation, Science Day, Geography Day etc. College also organizes National, State and College level seminars, workshops and webinars. The College has started an Earn and Learn Scheme for needy and financially weak students.

Institutional Weakness

Although the College was started in 2002, it has not been able to register under UGC act 1950 2(f) and 12 (B) till now. Due to the rural and hilly terrain of the College internet connectivity is low. Industrialization is far away from the College. The companies do not think positively about coming here for job placement. There is insufficient linguistic ability. The college is permanently unsubsidized and receives inadequate funding from the Government and the University. Raising funds is one of the most important challenges. Students are from hilly region and financially weaker background so they are not paying fees on regular basis. College has not started Post Graduate program and other short term courses yet. College has also not developed botanical garden.

Institutional Opportunity

College has an opportunity to get 2 (f) and 12 (B) registration. College can encourage students to specialize in sports as much as possible. In future the college can introduce professional skill-based courses in faculty of arts, commerce and science. Opportunity is there to give scope to the artistic talents of college students. Opportunity to introduce more number of departmental certificate course. The college can create smart and virtual classrooms. The college can establish an incubation center and start a Student Information Service Center. College can start PG as well as various short term courses.

Institutional Challenge

Since the College is in a remote area, the students have a challenge to improving language skill. Placement of 100% students in that place is a challenge. Because the industrial area is far from the College, the companies are not positive about coming to this place. Starting new value added courses will be a big challenge for the College. Increasing fund is one of the most important challenges.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

College provides wide range of degree courses at UG level in Arts, Commerce & Science according to quality policy of higher education .The norms and regulations prescribed by state Govt. and S.P.P University, Pune are followed strictly in the admission process.

The admission process is online and transparent. Prospectus provides the required information about subjects and course choices, fee structure, facilities available in the college and scholarships, etc. Financial support and concessions/installments in fees are offered to students. Admission Committee is framed for guiding to the students wherever necessary. The admission process is completed through using Bank Challan.

The College implements effectively the Syllabi revised by the University. The College has implemented CBCS Pattern since 2019 for all UG CBCS pattern.

A Course in Environment Awareness is compulsory for second year in all UG programmes. At Second year there are three elective options as special subject in Arts programme Chemistry is one special subject available for Science programme & Marketing is for Commerce program. The evaluation pattern for all programmes is semester basis, there are six semesters and each semester has six papers. For UG Course there are 132 credit along with 08 credit points other than curriculum to get a degree.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

College provides students centric method for teaching learning process this includes:-

Experiential Learning

The College provides experiential learning and makes students aware of social commitment. It encourages students for educational tours, industrial visits, science field visits and industrial training. Practical learning provides for various subject of Science. Commerce department encourages learning about working and financial literacy. Various field visit, study tour, historical tour, religious tour are oraganised for giving practical knowledge.

Participatory learning

The College conducts soft skill based development programme such as ,Leadership, time management, communication skills, presentation skills, interview skills, writing skills. Educational trips are organized by various departments. All departments conducts various activities & events like Seminars ,group discussion ,Quiz competition ,Poem reading ,speech competition ,flower arrangement ,Poster presentation, etc. NSS scheme is one of the effective examples of participative learning which is effectively implemented in College. Seven days special winter camp is organized under NSS scheme.

Development of Problem Solving Skills

Through NSS & various departments organize surveys of farmers, human health and soil health. It gives knowledge about problem solving skills.

Effective Teaching – Teachers use ICT enabled tools for the learning process.

The College has computers, internet facility, Wi-Fi, projector, LCD. The Department of English has Lingua Software which is useful for the students. College has MIS portal & MIS mobile app for teacher & students, Through this app teachers can fill their teaching plan as well as student's attendance online. Teachers made 103 audio-video lectures on various topics in Arts, Commerce program which is very useful for the students. In COVID era teachers provided education through this audio-video lectures as well as through Zoom & Google meet app.

Research, Innovations and Extension

College teachers are specially guided and are encouraged to prepare research papers. Teachers are encouraged to submit research papers for various seminars, workshops, Conference. Students are guided for the invention competition. Students are encouraged to create various invention projects for the Avishkar Competition and are sent for participation in the competition.

The faculty has published total 12 research papers in various journals notified on UGC Care list. In International and National proceeding 5 papers are published by the faculty members. Most of the faculty members participate in International, National conferences and seminars.

The College has participated in extension programmes in collaboration with Gramin Rugnalaya, Sakur such as health checkup camp, Covid testing & vaccination camp, Blood donation camp is organized in collaboration with Arpan & Aadhar blood bank. Tree Plantation at Women Empowerment, Cleaning of Graveyard, Voter Awareness Drive, Save Girl Child and Gender Equality programmes are organized by the College.

Blood donation camps, hemoglobin test, CBC test, village cleaning, etc. are organized regularly through NSS on the campus and off the campus.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The creation and enhancement of infrastructure that facilitates effective teaching and learning is an important perspective of the College. The policy of the College is to fulfill and upgrade the infrastructural requirements whenever required.

· Physical Facilities

The College has copious infrastructure which includes main building with administrative block, class rooms, central library, well-equipped laboratories, and Gymnasium Hall, girl's and boy's common room, IQAC office, NSS Office Staff Room, as well YCMOU Center and Computer Lab are well ventilated with sunlight. Facilities such as wash rooms are available in the campus. Most of the Departments of Science faculty have a separate laboratory with sophisticated instruments.

· Computing Equipment

For Proper ICT enabled teaching learning process, the College has provided LCD Projectors, Computer with Scanning, Printing and Xerox facilities. 50 Mbps bandwidth internet connection is provided to all the Departments and computer labs. Campus has 24x7 free Wi-fi connectivity. College has office software such as Tally, MIS mobile, App MIS portal and LMS portal.

· Sports And Games

The college has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games etc.

The college has all the sport equipment necessary for indoor and outdoor games.. viz. Table –Tennis, Chess, Carrom and Outdoor games facilities including Running Track and different sport ground viz. Kho-Kho,

Kabaddi, Long Jump, Volley Ball, Shot put, Javelin throw, Discus Throw, Cricket and Basketball grounds etc.

· Staff Quarter

College provides with well-equipped staff quarters for both the teaching as well as the non-teaching staff. Currently 9 staff members are staying in the staff quarters.

· The campus is under CCTV surveillance.

Student Support and Progression

The prospectus contains information of goals, mission and available courses, fee structures and all other necessary information. 95% students avail financial assistance through, State and Central Government schemes. Earn and Learn Scheme offers major support to the financial poor students. The College contribution to this scheme is 10%. The College provides support services such as Competitive Exam Guidance Cell, Remedial and Extra Coaching, Seminars and Career Guidance etc. Participation of students in Avishkar, etc. is encouraged. Importance is given on creating gender sensitization. Add on and skill enhancement courses such as soft skills, spoken English, communication skills, are available. Many students have taken the benefit of competitive examinations guidance center. College has MoU with some institutes for providing skill based education such as Nilaya, Satyam, Infoysis, Career Catta, etc. College also has MoU with various Business units for the internship of the students.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The College started with the vision "Our College is committed to strive for academic excellence by exploring the potentiality of economically weaker society and rural, tribal area through higher education and develop their overall personality with a broader perspective of social, national, environmental and global commitment. The College functions on the line of vision, mission and objectives. IQAC of the college consciously monitors the quality policy, which is reflected in all the activities of the college, which ensures the facilitative and participatory system for smooth functioning of the College with perspective planning. The College Development Committee regularly observe the quality of education . The Principal as the academic leader steers the college towards quality enhancement.

The Vice-Principal & all Heads of the Department contribute freely to the implementation of academic planning. Faculty members are voluntarily involved and positively encouraged for curricular, extracurricular and co-curricular activities. Various Stakeholders such as students, alumni and parents are involved in the functioning of the College. E governance has been executed by using Smart school MIS. The College has established a mechanism for conducting internal and external audits.

1.1 Curricular Planning and Implementation

Response:

The College is affiliated to SP Pune University. University designs and develops all programs of study offered by the College. Institute effectively oversees the academic planning of individual teachers for course delivery and proper implementation of curriculum.

College follows the following structured system for effective course delivery.

1. Workload Distribution

The College has a constructive way of distribution of work load. Various departments and committees are established to carry various academic and other activities.

2. Academic Calendar

The College has constituted an academic calendar committee . The committee prepares the academic calendar at the beginning of each academic year as per the academic calendar of SP Pune University. 3. Lecture Time Table Committee

Before the commencement of the academic year, the time table committee prepares class wise and program wise time tables. The time table is displayed on the notice board as well as in the classroom for the information of the students. Teachers are informed about their schedule through whats app group.

4. Skill Based Course Time Table

Along with the regular course of study in the College, the student acquires different skills. For this, students are guided by preparing skill based courses time table. This is beneficial for students to get jobs and become entrepreneurs.

5. Teaching Plan

Teachers prepare their Micro Learning Plan & Principal reviews the micro-plans prepared by the faculty members & teaching plan is finalised for proper implementation.

6. ICT Equivalent Pedagogy

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Effective classroom delivery technology is made available to teachers and students. Computer and Internet facilities Computer interface experiments are made available and teaching members are encouraged to use ICT tools. Necessary equipments are provided to the teachers. College teachers have prepared audio and video lectures.

7. Library Committee

A library committee has been established in the College. In the college library Books are exchanged with the students at the scheduled time. New books and Journals are purchased as per the requirement of the course.

8. University Academic Time Table & Holidays

The University provides an academic calendar which specifies the start and end date of the teaching study process for each semester including Government holidays. College also follows the University Holidays Calender.

9. Different Committees

Different committees are formed in the College at the beginning of the academic year, all the committees perform the prescribed functions.

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences and teachers use ICT- enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning process

Response:

The college encourages faculties to implement student centric methods by providing all the required resources and infrastructural facilities for using experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving and computer aided learning. To ensure that students play an active role in the learning process College tries to make teaching learning a two-way process where students are always allowed to participative in teaching learning activities. The college has adopted several student centric methods for

enhancing their learning process. This includes:

1. Experiential Learning

Experiential learning is the process of learning through experiences. It includes Field visit, Study tours and Project work. The study tours are organized by various departments through which student learn by observations. Also included botanical collection and laboratory work in term of practical etc. for science students. Department of commerce organizes visits to banks and co-operative organizations. It gives students knowledge regarding the corporate world. Students experience the weekly markets and study marketing strategies adopted at grass root level. Add-on courses help to develop practical skills among the students. Students visited Shivneri fort through N.S.S activity. Students got information about conservation and preservation of forts.

2. Participative Learning

Participative learning refers to the methodologies in which students are engaged in common tasks which redefines traditional student- teacher relationship in the classroom. Departments arrange group discussions, student seminars, project poster-presentation, debate competitions, exhibition, essay-writing, quiz competitions etc.

3. Problem Solving Methodologies

The problem-solving methodology helps the students to understand the situation and come out with alternatives. To enrich students' creativity, decision making, critical thinking and reasoning ability various methods are adopted by the College. Faculty encourages students to participate in research project competition and science exhibitions. It promotes students to identify and select their problems (scientific, social, and environmental) to plan hypothesis monitoring of experimental protocol and to approach toward expected conclusions. The College had organized lecture on soil testing to educate the farmers in the College neighbourhood about the properties of their land. Also survey was conducted by NSS students of special winter camp to raised awareness of corona vaccination.

4. ICT Based Teaching-Learning

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

College has established Examination Committee, consisting of five faculty members. Examination committee coordinates the internal and external examination at both college and University level. It provides necessary information to students, teachers and administrative staff for smooth functioning. Evaluation methods and examination schedules are displayed on the college notice boards. Internal assessment is done through various assessment methods. It includes class tests, multiple-choice tests, oral examinations, and assignments, term-end exams, mid- term and University examinations. Marks /credits depend on assignments, seminars, orals and practical. The internal exam timetable is prepared and forwarded to students ten days before the commencement of examination. Question papers are prepared as per University guidelines and submitted to exam department. Keeping in view the University guidelines, a vigilance squad at college level is formed including female teachers. Any change in Exam timetables, patterns and methods, is informed through whatsapp group. The subject teacher also informs the students about changes in the class room. Student complaints are redressed within allotted time. Students can freely interact with the teachers in order to resolve complaints. Online internal marks are submitted to the University through the teacher's login accounts. The college has CCTV cameras to keep watch on the entire process of examination. The college Exam Committee resolves the complaints related to the University examinations. Complaints related to examination form, incorrect entry of marks, queries related to subject codes, programs, wrong entries in names, hall tickets and absenteeism are addressed in specified time.

Grievances related to College examination:

Assessment of answer books for all first year UG internal and external and internal of second and third year examinations is done centrally through college examination committee at the college level. The entire complaints are sorted out immediately by the college examination committee as per the rules and regulations of Savitribai Phule Pune University. Procedure for this includes:

- 1. Students have to communicate complaint to college CEO.
- 2. Student complaints regarding evaluation if not given clarification. or If students are not satisfied they are required to meet the Principal.
- 3.CEO will communicate with the respective HOD and teacher to sort out the complaint.
- 4. If complaint is regarding external exams, then university is informed of the same. e.g.questions out of syllabus etc.
- 5. The process is fully transparent and completed in a week's time. Thus the mechanism of internal / external assessment is transparent and grievance redressal system is time bound and efficient.

The creation and enhancement of infrastructure that facilitates effective teaching and learning is an important perspective of the College. The policy of the College is to fulfill and upgrade the infrastructural requirements whenever required.

1. Physical Facilities

The College has copious infrastructure which includes main building with administrative block, class rooms, central library, well-equipped laboratories, and Gymnasium Hall, girls' and boy's common room, NAAC office, NSS Office Staff Room, as well YCMOU Center and Computer Lab are well ventilated with sunlight. Facilities such as wash rooms are available in the campus. Most of the Departments of science faculty have a separate laboratory with sophisticated instruments. Library has enriched with 7339 books and 249 Reference books and is facilitated with spacious reading hall. The library also has subscription for National Journal, Magazine's e-book's / e-journals.

2. Computing Equipment

For Proper ICT enabled teaching learning process, the College has provided LCD Projectors, Computer with Scanning, Printing and Xerox facilities. 50 Mbps bandwidth internet connection is provided to all the departments and computer labs. Campus has 24x7 free Wi-fi connectivity. College has a well-furnished Computer Laboratory of 23 computers with internet connectivity and LAN facility for students. College has office software, Tally, MIS mobile App MIS portal and LMS portal. There are also printers and scanners as well as language software is made available.
